PONY SHOWING CLASSES

Judge: Phillipa MacInnes

Ring 1 commencing at 9am prompt (Showing Ring) - Ponies 14.2hh and under

- Class 1 Best Turned Out. Rider any age.
- Class 2 Lead Rein Pony, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 122cm. Rider not to have attained their 8th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 3 First Ridden Pony, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 122cm. Rider not to have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 4 Family Pony, 4 years old and over. Rider aged 16 and under.
- Class 5 Pony Club Pony, 4 years old and over. Rider under 25 years of age. A small jump may be included at the Judge's discretion.
- Class 6 Coloured Pony, 4 years old and over. Rider aged 16 and under.
- Class 7 Veteran Pony, pony age 15 years and over. Rider any age.
- Class 8 Best Rider, rider aged 16 and under.

PONY CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES 2-8

<u>Ring 1 (Showing Ring) – Ponies 14.2hh and under. Rider any age.</u> **ENTRY FEE IS ONLY £5 FOR CLASSES 9-12**

- Class 9 Pony with the Best Mane and Tail
- Class 10 Pony that the Judge would most like to take home
- Class 11 Cutest Combination
- Class 12 Horse and Hound, in hand, best pair judged on compatibility of horse and dog

Mountain & Moorland

(If sufficient entries, ridden classes may be split into large and small breeds)

- Class 13 Mountain & Moorland Young Stock, 3 years old and under. Large and small breeds.
- Class 14 Mountain & Moorland In Hand, 4 years old and over. Large and small breeds.
- Class 15 Mountain & Moorland Novice Ridden, Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age. (Rider of Stallions must be 14 years or over)
- Class 16 Mountain & Moorland Open Ridden, Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age. (Rider of Stallions must be 14 years or over)

HORSE SHOWING CLASSES

Judge: Sarah-Jayne Bowers

Ring 1 commencing not before 1.30pm (Showing Ring) – Horses exceeding 14.2hh unless otherwise stated

- Class 18 Best Turned Out
- Class 19 Novice Horse, 4 years old and over, not to have won 1st prize in any showing class (excluding Turn Out) prior to 31st July 2019. Snaffle bridles only to be worn. No group canter. Judge will not ride in this class.
- Class 20 Best Cob or Cob Type, 4 years old and over, any height, rider any age.
- Class 21 Show Hunter, 4 years old and over. Horses entered in Class 21 cannot enter Class 22.
- Class 22 Riding Horse, 4 years old and over. Horses entered in Class 22 cannot enter Class 21.
- Class 23 Coloured Horse, open to mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height, any type, rider any age.
- Class 24 Veteran Horse, 15 years and over. Open to mare or gelding, any height, any type, rider any age. No spurs allowed.
- Class 25 Riding Club Horse, 4 years old and over. A small jump may be included at the Judge's discretion.
 Snaffle bridles only to be worn and no spurs. Competitors to be a member of an affiliated Riding Club.
 Membership number to be included on entry form. Trophy Sponsored by Ayr Riding Club.
- Class 26 Best BHS Member. Open to mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height, any type, rider any age. (Confined to BHS Members).

Class 29:	60cm Class - Open to Horses, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm			
Class 30:	70cm Class - Open to Horses, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm			
Class 31:	80cm Class - Open 4 Horses, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm			
Class 32:	90cm Class - Open 4 Horses, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm			

PONY SHOWJUMPING

<u>Ring 3: Followed by Showjumping – Ponies (Riders any age)</u> (Will be run as single phase) Commencing not before 12.30pm

Class 33:	Cross poles – Open to Ponies, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm
Class 34:	50cm Class - Open to Ponies, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm
Class 35:	60cm Class - Open to Ponies, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm
Class 36:	70cm Class - Open to Ponies, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm
Class 37:	80cm - Open to Ponies, 4years old and over, not exceeding 148cm
Class 38:	50cm – Horse and Hound, any size, horse / pony to be 4 years and over, rider any age
Class 39:	50cm / 70cm – Pairs, any combination, horse / pony to be 4 years and over

Making an entry implies acceptance of this.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. The Judges decision is final.
- 2. Riders/Handlers must give due consideration to all others on the showground.
- 3. The Organisers reserve the right to (a) cancel any class (b) divide or amalgamate any class (c) alter the advertised times (d) refuse any entry without giving a reason.
- 4. Officials must be obeyed at all times. Abuse of officials, including verbal abuse, will not be tolerated and may result in elimination or the rider / handler.
- 5. The show will be held in accordance with The British Horse Society Guidelines for the Welfare of Horses and Ponies at Events'. Copies of the guidelines are available from The British Horse Society (<u>www.bhs.org.uk</u>) or a paper copy will be supplied by the BHS upon request.
- 6. All riders should be safely and smartly dressed. Long hair should be in a hairnet, and tied in such a way as to not hang below the collar.
- 7. All riders must wear hard hats with a fixed harness to comply with the 2019 BHS Guidelines. Due to a change by the European Commission regarding EN1384 and BSEN1384 no longer being an accepted standard, all hats which ONLY meet the standard EN1384 or BSEN1384, and do not comply with another accepted standard WILL NOT be permitted for use. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 ALONG WITH another accepted standard will be permitted. For example, BSEN & PAS015 (1998 or 2011) or along with the Kitemark would be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own. Hats which are VG1 01.040 (2014-12) with Kitemark, ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), SNELL E2001 or AS/NZS3838 (2006 onwards) are accepted.
