Join BHS Scotland for a delightful new ride for 2019, through the estate surrounding Dumfries House, Ayrshire. Dumfries House is one of Britain's most beautiful stately homes set in 2,000 acres of land, saved by the intervention of His Royal Highness, The Prince Charles, Duke of Rothesay in 2007.

This is a guided ride by Denise Richardson-Rowell, Education Farmer Manager, who is also a BHS Accredited Professional Coach.

The ride will set out at 10am prompt, last for approximately 1 hour and will take in the beautiful grounds of Dumfries House Estate including riding past the Main House, Arbornetum, Adams Bridge, Duchess of Rothesay Avenue and also a chance to go through the river and have a canter in the fields (weather permitting).

The ride will be held to fundraise jointly for the British Horse Society and Help the Heroes (nominated charity for 2019 by Dumfries House) – it is such a privilege to be able to ride within the grounds of Dumfries House.

Entries: £15 per rider to be paid, plus a minimum £10 in sponsorship paid on the day.

Entries limited to 25 on a first come, first served basis - to be received by Monday 11 March 2019.

Sorry, no entries on the day.



The ride will start from Home Farm, Dumfries House Estate, Cumnock, KA18 2LP.

Enter the Estate via the B7036 /Barony Road, from Ochiltree to Auchinleck Road.

****PLEASE NO VEHICLES ENTER THE ESTATE DIRECTLY FROM THE MAIN ENTRANCE ON THE A70****

Ground Rules for the Ride:

Please keep off the grass while riding past the big house and through the Arbornetum (The Duchess of Rothesay Avenue).

DUMFRIES HOUSE ESTATE SPONSORED RIDE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All riders must wear hard hats with a fixed harness to comply with the 2019 BHS guidelines - due to a change by the European Commission regarding EN1384 and BSEN1384 no longer being an accepted standard, all hats which ONLY meet the standard EN1384 or BSEN1384, and do not comply with another accepted standard WILL NOT be permitted for use. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 ALONG WITH another accepted standard, will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384 and PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own.
2. Riders aged 14 and under must be accompanied on the ride by a responsible and suitably experienced adult.
3. All horses / ponies to be 4 years or over.
4. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure their horse is fit and healthy enough to complete the chosen distance comfortably. Please be sensible—if your horse or a horse in your stables has been ill in the month running up to the event please don't come along. The horse's passport and a current valid vaccination certificate must be brought on the day otherwise entry may be refused.
5. Instructions of organisers, officials and stewards must be followed to promote the safety of everyone present.
6. The routes incorporate some roadwork so reflective clothing must be worn on horse and rider.
7. All riders are expected to follow the Scottish Outdoor Access Code and must expect to open and close gates on the route.
8. Vet and farrier on call, but not on site. First aid on site.
9. Please leave the parking area as you found it—don't muck out your trailer or lorry in the parking area, and take your dung home with you. Thank you!
10. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor British Horse Society Scotland nor the Barskimming Estate nor any agent, employee, representative of these bodies accepts liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
