It is a requirement of your Almond membership that members complete at least 1 helper stint (i.e. 1 half day at event or 1 set up session) in 2019. **To sign up to** please get in touch with Karyn – by replying to your newsletter

email, or contact Jo Tavern on Facebook. Jo will post up Helpers wanted on the Almond group Facebook page.

Helping is a great way to learn from trainers and judges while writing, scoring, stewarding on the day. If your horse is off or you are sadly horseless at the moment it is also a great way of still being involved and active within the club and a chance meet up for a chat with fellow members! If you are not sure about what a particular job involves, we will help you. There's lots of helper jobs - scoring, stewarding, dressage writing, pole picking, set up sessions helping to build courses and arenas etc.

\*\***New**\*\* for this year we are going to run a Helpers points scheme. Joanne Tavern, Karyn Hynd and Ali Chaffe are going to co-ordinate all this!

**\*\*New \*\*** We also know some members who do much more than their minimum requirement of 1 helper stint and you are regularly first to put a hand up to help. The helper team are going to record who has helped when throughout 2019 and if you have clocked up 5 helper stints you will be eligible to a free entry for a competition class or half price lesson at any club day. (this does not apply to Harry clinics).
